

## THE ORIGIN of VAMPIRES

Thousands of years BC when man first started walking upright there were evolutionary differences. Most of the variants died out leaving what most of us believe that we were the sole survivor.

Actually, there was a very small number of these earlyites that were part of a clan or family that were different. Not all in that pod, just a few. These 'others' stood out as they were physically in better shape than the others. They lived a little longer, they were stronger, and most notably, their canine teeth were larger.
